What: Workshop is on washing a raw fleece and preparation of that fiber. Tracey will be donating a fleece to use or you can bring your own if you have one. Bring your spinning wheel or spindles to sample the prepared fiber.
When: May 29 and 30 from 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM
Where: Yule Farm, 3855 N. Campbell Road, Palmer, Alaska
Class Size: Limited to 10
Cost: \$40.00 (Plus a \$3.00 charge for registration)

<u>Description of Class</u>: This is a beginner's class to learn fleece preparation. We will wash a raw fleece and then comb or card it to prepare it for dying, spinning, or whatever the final process will be.

<u>Goals/Learning outcome</u>: Learn what materials are needed to prepare a raw fleece. Learn the process of washing/cleaning a raw fleece. Learn different methods of fiber preparation.
