Monthly Inspiration: Fair Isle!



In celebration of all things fair-related, this month's inspiration is this little Fair Isle hat that can be knitted up just in time for the weather to turn (into those not-so-fair temps). This free pattern comes from [Purl Soho](#).

The term "Fair Isle knitting" is often used to describe any type of multicolored geometric patterned knitwear.

However, traditional Fair Isle-style knitting comes from the remote island of Fair Isle, just north of Scotland. Similar to the history of knitting itself, much of the information surrounding the history of Fair Isle knitting comes from folklore. The story I've heard most tells of a ship from Spanish Armada that wrecked on Fair Isle in 1588. The community took the sailors in and in return the Spaniards taught the islanders the style of knitting we consider "Fair Isle." No matter what history you have heard, Fair Isle is fun to do!
