Workshops

This year's workshops will center around a new division for the Alaska State Fair called Fleece to Finish. Each workshop will include a skill necessary to complete a project from a raw fleece. Some workshops will be held in conjunction with the Anchorage Spinners and Weavers Guild.

Introduction to Spinning Fiber—December 10 at Turkey Red 11am-2pm with Laurie Sitkiewicz. Join us for a beginning class for learning to spin fiber. In this class you will learn the parts of the spinning wheel, why you would want to spin your own fiber, types of fiber preparation, fiber preparation tools, and how to make a beginning single. Including, what makes a good single and how to join a break. Supplies you will need are a working spinning wheel, 2-3 bobbins, a lazy kate, and a niddy noddy. All other supplies will be provided. Space is limited to 10 participants. Cost \$65

Next Step Plying—December 11 at Turkey Red 11am-2pm with Laurie Sitkiewicz. This class is all about next level plying. In this class you will learn why you would ply your fiber, plying principles, Types of plying and why you would use them, 2 ply, 3 ply, and Novelty to include soft plied with fine, change of angle of hands, Knop yarn, Boucle, Cable, and Crepe. Supplies needed: Working Spinning Wheel, 3-4 bobbins, Lazy Kate, Niddy Noddy. Space is limited to 10 participants. Cost \$65
