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# **Updates**

## Workshops

This year's workshops will center around a new division for the Alaska State Fair called Fleece to Finish. Each workshop will include a skill necessary to complete a project from a raw fleece. Some workshops will be held in conjunction with the Anchorage Spinners and Weavers Guild.

**Fleece Preparation** - **Nov 12-13 10am-3pm at Yule Farm** (3855 N Campbell Rd, Palmer, AK 99645) with Tracey Eason and Natalie Wolfe. <u>Day One</u> is all about preparing and washing raw fleece. You will learn about different methods of washing fleece and practice washing your own fleece. <u>Day Two</u> you will learn to card or comb your clean fiber in preparation for spinning or felting. All supplies will be provided; however, you can bring your own fleece if you have one you want to work with. **Cost \$50**.

**Introduction to Spinning Fiber—December 10 (TBD)** with Laurie Sitkiewicz. This class is for the beginning spinner. Try your hand at the ancient craft of spinning natural fibers on a wheel. \*If you have already learned to draft your fiber on a traditional drop-spindle, you will find learning to spin on a wheel much easier.\* In this class, you will learn how to spin using already prepared wool roving. You will learn the steps that take the roving (that is, strands of fiber) and teach you how to spin the fiber into a finished yarn. You will then learn how to ply your yarn and make a skein of homespun yarn that you can take home. Cost TBD

**Advanced Spinning Techniques—December 11 (TBD)** with Laurie Sitkiewicz. This class is intended for established spinners. Learn more about your wheel and different techniques to improve your spinning or a technique that is new to you. Cost TBD.
