October Meeting

*Treasurer's Report:

- The treasurer's report was passed around: Money Market has \$12,254.45; Checking has \$4,966.82; Savings has \$37.84. There are 75 members paid up so far for 2024. New rack cards have been ordered, and both the post office box and taxes have been paid.

*Equipment rentals:

Vice President Valerie presented the results from the May survey on rental equipment needs. The survey revealed the most requested items were for spinning. Since the guild already has 6 wheels available, Valerie will concentrate on creating beginner kits with everything that is needed for spinning and these will be rented with the spinning wheels.

- * President Kelsey opened discussion for ideas on how to better engage the membership.
 - -A request was made for someone to anchor the Monday knit night at Vagabond Blues and Stephanie Bass volunteered.
 - -Suggested: A directory of members and their skills that can be shared with others, so if a member has a question about a technique there is someone to contact.
 - -Suggested: Craft Day / Intro to a craft day (i.e.: Learn to knit, spin, crochet, etc.) or something like a drop-in craft day. The Wasilla Library was suggested as a possible place to gather.

*Report on the State Fair from Jude:

- -More entries encouraged, for this year the number of entries is up but the number of those who make entries is slightly lower. Jude encourages more people to get involved and enter your fiber creations in next year's Alaska State Fair.
- -A big change in entry next year is that all entries will be digital. More information on how all that will work will be coming in early 2025.
- -The State Fair theme for next year has been announced as "Reach for the Stars"
