#### Treasurer Report:

Money Market: \$17,248.91; Checking: 3,895.24; Savings: 37.88

#### Vice President Report:

Currently reviewing the survey of equipment needs that was taken last spring to help determine equipment needed to meet member needs.

#### Workshop Coordinator:

The new monthly meeting **Sheep Breed study** was explained. Papers explaining how the study will work and a breakdown of breeds and payment plans were passed out to all those present. September's breed is Jacob. After show and tell, Kelsey weighed out the fleece for those interested in participating. Contact Natalie if you can't attend a meeting and arrange a way to pick up a fleece or have it mailed to you.

**October Retreat** is Oct 18-20 at Camp Marantha: The retreat will be at Langley Hall only (Camp Maranatha now requires 80+ participants before they open the gym for use). Natalie is looking for other places that might be able to accommodate our needs better. The master felter that was originally planned for the October retreat has been postponed.

### November "Out of the Box" Sale

Julia Lenz reports that the date of the sale this year is Saturday November 23 at the Palmer Train Depot. Of special note is: this is the Saturday before Thanksgiving instead of the usual Saturday after Thanksgiving. She is asking for more help at the sale, mainly with cleanup of the depot after the meeting.

shawls and got them submitted to the State Fair. Thank you to all who participated. Members are encouraged to participate next year.
